“Only the high priest passed behind the second veil into the Holy of Holies (Heb. 9:8). Perfect access to God had not been restored. God’s provision of the tabernacle was a great blessing but not the final solution. The antitype of the Holy of Holies is the personal presence of God in Heaven (Heb. 9:24). The Holy of Holies prophetically pointed to the place where man would have access to God because the sin question would have been answered. While the high priest could only enter the Holy of Holies once a year (Heb. 9:7; cf. Lev. 16), Jesus Christ has entered into the presence of God once and for all for us.” John R.
